THE BADAMI OUTSTANDING ALUMNUS AWARD

DANIEL COLON, M.S.

"The moment you doubt whether you can fly, you cease forever to be able to do it." —Peter Pan, J.M. Barrie

When we speak of the Dominican difference and its wonderful spirit, Daniel Colon comes to mind as he personifies the mission of Dominican University New York. As an undergraduate student at the University, he consistently strove for educational excellence. As a research scientist in the area of virology, he has shown his concern for improving the health environment of the community at large.

Born to parents struggling with drug addiction and gang affiliation, Dan's early life was not one that would necessarily lead to future professional success. Fortunately for him, while he was still an infant, his paternal grandmother recognized that his environment was not only an unsuitable one for a child, but a dangerous one as well. She became his custodial parent, thus ensuring that he would always be provided with a stable and loving environment in which to grow up. Knowing that he did not want to inherit the lifestyle of his parents, Dan recognized that through education, he could achieve a better life than they had. Thus, in fall 2007, he enrolled in what was then Dominican College of Blauvelt, declaring a major in Biology in the spring of his freshman year. Through the support and encouragement of his faculty and others at the College, Dan was shown another form of love and acceptance.

In his final semester at Dominican, Dan enrolled in a "Molecular Microbiology" course taught by Dr. Bernadette Connors, who introduced him to the book *The Hot Zone: A Terrifying True Story*, by Richard Preston, which details incidents involving viral hemorrhagic fevers, such as Ebola. In 2013, as a newly graduated biology student, Dan was hired as a research assistant at NYU Langone in a laboratory that studied tumor detection and growth in a mouse model system. From NYU, Dan secured a position at Profectus Biosciences, later Auro Vaccines, where he had the opportunity to pursue work in the very field that Dr. Connors introduced him to, virology research and discovery. There he worked collaboratively with a team of scientists whose aim was to develop vaccines to treat viral diseases such as HIV and Hepatitis C. This work ignited in him a passion to integrate science and service to humanity, a passion that defines him today. Currently, Dan is a research and development specialist at Regeneron Pharmaceuticals, Inc., working with other scientists dedicated to not only advancing scientific knowledge, but to saving lives across the globe.

Dan has been invited back to Dominican University on multiple occasions to talk with Biology majors and other students about both his personal and professional journey. His message about overcoming the most difficult of beginnings through the love and dedication of both his extended family and his mentors here at Dominican resonates deeply with these students. Through these talks, he shows the next generation of Dominican students that where one comes from does not need to determine who one becomes. Dan has also given back by starting an intern program, personally mentoring numerous Dominican students over the years. He has also supported the hiring of Dominican graduates for entry-level positions in the vaccine industry.

Daniel Colon has proven that we can all use our struggles to fuel the fire that drives us forward and prove to the world that we can be better than what might be expected of us. Today, Dan is married to his soulmate Michele, and together, they have two beautiful young children, Raegan and Miles. It is for his accomplishments, past, present, and future, Dominican University New York is proud to present Daniel Colon with the **2023 Badami Outstanding Alumnus Award**.

CONFERRAL OF VERITAS MEDAL

SR. JEAN GRAFFWEG, O.P., M.S.

"Tell the children how wonderful they are and they will be wonderful." –National CACFP

A passion for the enablement of others and a keen desire to alleviate the impoverishments of humankind have characterized the lives of both Sr. Jean Marie Rathgaber, founder of the House on the Hill Migrant Child Care Center in Goshen, New York; and Sr. Jean Graffweg, current Director of House on the Hill.

True to the Dominican charism of study, Sr. Rathgaber earned a master's degree in Sacred Science from St. Bonaventure's and a doctorate in Education from Fordham University. Sr. Jean Graffweg, a graduate of Dominican (Class of 1970), obtained a Masters from Providence College where she was recognized as an "Outstanding Elementary Teacher of America."

In 1972, following the completion of her service as Academic Dean of what was then Dominican College of Blauvelt, Sr. Jean Marie Rathgaber founded the House on the Hill, a comprehensive educational day care center to care for the young children of families who worked the black dirt fields of Florida and Pine Island in Orange County, New York. Her initial staff included Sr. Barbara McEneany, Sr. Peter Bridget, and Sr. Adrian Paolilli who cared for the youngsters who, prior to the founding of the House on the Hill, had been resting in boxes as their parents picked onions, lettuce, and radishes.

For over five decades, the Sisters of Saint Dominic of Blauvelt have been serving the children of farm workers in Orange County. Located in Goshen, New York, the House on the Hill has served as an early childhood migrant seasonal head start center that provides education, family engagement, health, and nutrition services. The children served range in age from two months to five years. For 42 of these 50 years, Sr. Jean Graffweg has ministered at House on the Hill, being involved there as teacher, cook, bus driver and, for the past fifteen years, as Director. Whatever had to be done, Sr. Jean was available. She was ably assisted by Sr. Pat Kuhlow, Sr. Anthony Jerome, Sr. Caritas, and a generous lay staff. For all of them, nothing was more important than the growth and happiness of the children.

Today, in her role as Director, most days for Sr. Jean start as early as 6:00 a.m. when children begin to arrive. By 7:00 a.m., House on the Hill is filled with infants, toddlers, preschool, and pre-kindergarten children. Each child begins the day with a warm hug of welcome. They are fed breakfast and later lunch and a snack. The rest of the day is focused on language development, literacy, pre-mathematics and science, creative arts, social and emotional development, physical health, problem-solving, and the development of initiative. Acres of rolling hills surround House on the Hill and provide healthy exercise for the young children. Many who have been educated at House on the Hill return to share the experience with their own children. Sr. Jean is a meaningful role model in the lives of the families and children she serves.

Dominican University New York is honored to award the **2023 Veritas Medal** to Sr. Jean Graffweg; in memoriam, to Sr. Jean Marie Rathgaber; and to all those who have worked and continue to work faithfully with them in service of migrant families and their children.

P. JOSEPH CORLESS, P.E., M.B.A, M.S.

"Scientists investigate that which already is; Engineers create that which has never been." —Albert Einstein

The professional career of P. Joseph Corless has masterfully fulfilled the criteria noted in the above quotation. With a Bachelor of Civil Engineering degree from Manhattan College and an MBA and a Master of Science from NYU, as well as continuing education courses in construction management, urban planning, and environmental engineering, Joe has served as a trusted professional, a generous and adept trustee, and, perhaps most importantly, as a splendid leader.

With registration in both New York and New Jersey in his profession and as a New York and New Jersey Land Surveyor and Land Planner, Joe earned a deeply respected reputation for his strong understanding of the issues confronting organizations and new developments being undertaken. During his over 50 years of environmental and civil engineering activity, his leadership as Assistant Commissioner for Environmental Health for Rockland County, as Executive Director of the Haverstraw Joint Sewerage Board, and as town and village engineer for more than a dozen New York State municipalities, Joe's career has been an exceptional asset to the region.

Dominican University New York has been a benefactor of Joe's professional and leadership abilities for over thirty years. Joe has been a member of both the President's Advisory Council and the University's Board of Trustees, to which he was elected in 1989. He served as Chair of the Board for six years and was later granted status as Trustee Emeritus in recognition of his many invaluable services to the institution.

During his Trusteeship, Joe volunteered to serve as Project Engineer, overseeing the construction of the multiple campus facilities built and/or acquired during his tenure on the Board. His tremendous efforts and commitments to working on site plans, environmental reviews, contracts, RFP's, budget negotiations, and so on, in great measure, made possible the development of Dominican's campus.

For his generous commitment to the current and future generations of Dominican University and for his excellent contributions to the community, Dominican University New York is honored to award P. Joseph Corless the degree of **Doctor of Science**, *honoris causa*.

VICTOR B. LAWRENCE, PH.D.

"It always seems impossible until it's done" —Nelson Mandela

As a boy growing up in Ghana, on the western coast of Africa, Victor Lawrence heard President Kennedy's iconic Moon speech in 1962, broadcast on the Voice of America, pledging that U.S. astronauts would go to the moon before the end of the decade. The thought of space exploration piqued his interest in science and engineering and put him on a path to becoming an electrical engineer and an inventor of ground breaking technologies. Dr. Lawrence's discoveries led to worldwide access to the internet and high-definition television (HDTV). Among his many accomplishments, his work has advanced gigabit photonic and wireless networking, signal processing, modem technology, digital techniques, and ATM switching and protocols. Dr. Lawrence was instrumental in bringing submarine fiber optic communication to Africa, and is a champion for introducing technology to under served areas in the United States and the developing world.

After graduating from secondary school in Ghana, Dr. Lawrence was awarded a full scholarship to the Imperial College of Science and Technology at the University of London, where he earned a Bachelor of Science and a Ph.D. in electrical engineering. His pioneering work on digital signal processing at the University of London caught the attention of Bell Labs, and he was subsequently recruited to work in the United States. Dr. Lawrence describes Bell Labs as a utopian workplace where everyone had a common goal-to create and develop technology for humanity. He worked there for 32 years and rose through the ranks, retiring as Vice President for Advanced Communications Technology at AT&T Bell Laboratories and Lucent Technologies. As Vice President, he led the development of technologies for worldwide communications networks, oversaw a staff of more than 500 scientists and engineers, and managed a budget of about \$100 million.

In 2016, Dr. Lawrence was inducted into the National Inventors Hall of Fame. He holds 53 U.S. and international patents, is the co-author of five books, and has published more than 100 papers. Dr. Lawrence has received many awards including a 1997 Emmy Award for his work on the development of HDTV. He received the 2004 Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) Award in International Communication and the 2016 IEEE Simon Ramo Medal for technical innovation and leadership in the systems engineering of worldwide data communications networks.

After leaving AT&T Bell Laboratories, Dr. Lawrence joined Stevens Institute of Technology in Hoboken, NJ, where he served as Associate Dean and Charles Batchler Chair Professor of Engineering. He is now a Senior Research Scientist and Director of the Center for Intelligent Networked Systems at Stevens. Despite all he has accomplished, Dr. Lawrence hopes to be remembered more for his loyalty to Bell Labs and to his colleagues than for his achievements. He is grateful that he had the opportunity to guide the greatest minds at Bell Labs and to invent systems that continue to change the world. Dr. Lawrence also has mentored many students and young professionals in the U.S., Europe, and Africa.

In recognition of his extraordinary career inventing technologies that have improved life around the globe, his tireless advocacy for worldwide access to the internet, and his steadfast commitment to mentor the next generation of inventors, Dominican University New York is pleased to confer upon Dr. Victor Lawrence the degree of **Doctor of Science**, *honoris causa*.

THE MACE

A mace is a ceremonial staff that has been a symbol of authority and power for centuries. It represents the University's academic heritage and is a vital part of the Commencement Ceremony, reinforcing the gravity and tradition of the event. The University

President appoints the Mace Bearer, generally a senior member of the faculty. This Mace Bearer leads the platform party in the procession that begins the Commencement Ceremony. Dominican University New York's walnut-fluted mace features a brass

medallion with the University seal on both sides. Honoring the University's mission, the words Excellence, Leadership, and Service are engraved on the mace, thus it serves as a powerful reminder of the University's mission and commitment.

THE TRADITION OF ACADEMIC ATTIRE

The caps, gowns, and hoods worn at college and university functions date back to the Middle Ages. Monks and students used them to keep warm in medieval castles and halls of learning. From these practical origins they have developed into the accepted garb symbolizing scholarly achievement.

Baccalaureate gowns have a long, pleated front with shirring across the shoulders and back. They are primarily distinguished by flowing sleeves, pointed at the fingertips. These gowns may be worn either open or closed.

The master's degree gown is worn open, and the sleeve is cut so that the forearm comes through a slit above the elbow. Gowns for the doctor's degree are also worn open. They carry broad,

velvet panels down the front, and three velvet bars on the full, round sleeves. This velvet trimming may be either black or the color distinctive of the degree.

The hood gives color and real meaning board symbolize scholastic to the academic costume. Its silk lining bears the colors of the institution conferring the degree. The hood is bordered with velvet of a prescribed width and color to indicate the field of learning to which the degree pertains.

Hoods worn by candidates in today's ceremonies are lined with red and black, the colors of Dominican University New York. Their velvet borders are tinted with colors representing the degree being conferred.

Faculty members in the academic procession are robed in gowns and hoods representing the institutions from which they have degrees.

Honors Tassels worn on the mortar achievement at Dominican University New York. Students receive the white tassel for one year of excellence; red for two years of excellence; and gold, the highest honor, for attaining scholastic honors for three years.

Graduates who are members of the National Honor Society, Alpha Chi, wear the white stole which has the letters of the Society in emerald green and a sapphire blue ribbon signifying their active membership in the Dominican University New York Chapter.
