## A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



### Dear Friends,

It is my pleasure to present to you the 2014–2015 Annual Report, which highlights Dominican College's achievements over the past year. The Dominican Difference—a spirit of community and collaboration is pervasive throughout the campus. You can see it in the classrooms, in the residence halls, and at the social events. Furthermore, the Dominican Difference extends beyond the campus, to the local community and into the world where students volunteer and alumni work and serve others.

This year's Annual Report will begin with a focus on the Dominican Tradition which began in the 13th Century when Saint Dominic founded an Order dedicated to the search for the truth. He proposed that this mission would be accomplished through study, prayerful reflection, community and ministry, especially preaching and teaching. That tradition has been handed down for eight centuries and is alive today on the College's campus. The College's mission statement reinforces this orientation by supporting "an ideal of education rooted in the values of reflective understanding and compassionate involvement." Dominican College has been blessed to have alumni who so treasured this tradition that they have returned to campus as employees and Board members. In the pages that follow you will read what the Dominican influence has meant for them.

It has been an exciting year for Dominican College. The College undertook a branding initiative which resulted in a new logo and a renewed focus on its identity and core values—a community built on mutual respect and rooted in its Catholic and Dominican tradition; an education conveyed by competent, accessible and involved professors, committed to student success; an institution that stressed the value of the liberal arts and encouraged a commitment to social justice and responsible citizenship.

The College was delighted to be awarded more than \$590,000 from the National Science Foundation to provide scholarships to able students studying the biological sciences. Also, during this past year, Dominican received approval from the New York State Education Department to offer a doctorate in Nursing Practice. This follows the implementation of the Advanced Certificate in Healthcare Management.

As the College strives to achieve higher educational standards, the Facilities Department continues to work on the maintenance or enhancement of the buildings and properties that comprise the seventy acre campus. Roofs were replaced on Hertel and Forkel Halls; the project to upgrade Casey with new energy efficient windows was completed; and an outdoor Reflection Center near Forkel Hall was constructed.

For the second year in a row the Annual Fund contributed over a million dollars to support operations. The refinancing of the 2004 and 2006 bond issues into private placement with Bank United was accomplished and the interest rate swap agreements were terminated. The new arrangement resulted in a lower level of debt service. The fiscal year ended with a modest surplus of \$800,000. The freshman class for fall 2015, exceeded projections by 44 promising students, 74% of whom decided to live on campus. The College's Residence Program reached capacity with 650 students living on campus.

The future looks bright for Dominican College. A land usage study was conducted by Derck & Edson in concert with the College's planning team. A new Master Plan will be completed during 2015–2016 and will guide the College forward during the next decade.

The College remains grateful for the vision of its dedicated Board and its creative faculty, student life personnel, administrators and staff. We continue to ask God's blessing on all the members of the College community and its many benefactors. Thank you for keeping Dominican College in your prayers and among your priorities.

# The Dominican Influence

The centuries-old Dominican tradition of pursuing the truth, while being compassionately involved in the community, and taking time for reflection is pervasive on the Dominican College campus.

That intellectual tradition was foreseen by St. Dominic's mother in a dream she had before his birth in 1170 in which a dog with a burning torch in its mouth was racing around the globe. Since the founding of the Order of Preachers, or Dominicans, in 1216, men and women in the Order have interpreted that dream as a burning search for truth, aglow with compassion, and a desire to set the world afire by preaching and reaching out to people in need.

On the Orangeburg campus of Dominican College, the Dominican influence promotes an educational environment where faculty and administrators are committed to a way of learning that brings students to the truth. Dominican College students receive a strong liberal arts foundation that allows them to think critically, in a small, supportive, classroom setting with an average student-faculty ratio of 15:1.

Dominican College students are acutely aware that they have something to contribute to the world around them. They learn to effectively understand the needs of others and how to meet those needs. This has led to a thriving commitment to social justice and community service on campus.

## The Dominican Influence in Action

### Fanjeaux Pilgrimage

As part of an ongoing effort to keep the Dominican tradition alive, Dominican College and nine other Dominican Colleges and Universities in the U.S. participated in a trip this spring to the medieval hilltop town in France where St. Dominic lived.

In all, 40 faculty, staff, and students visited Fanjeaux, where St. Dominic's vision of an order devoted to seeking and sharing the truth took shape from 1206 to 1216. Two students and one administrator from Dominican College in Orangeburg took part in the 17-day trip from May 26 to June 11.

The pilgrims studied each morning. In the afternoons, they visited historic sites in southern France, with a focus on places significant in the early history of the Order of Preachers. The program concluded with four nights in Paris.

Interested participants submit applications for the program. This year, those chosen were Kiara Rivera, '16; Kayla Lyder, '16; and Ryan O'Gorman, Director of Residence Life.

"Going on the pilgrimage trip to Fanjeaux, France allowed me to have a greater understanding of who I am, who St. Dominic was, and how the Dominican Charisma is found in each of the pilgrims who were on the journey together," said O'Gorman. "This was a life-changing experience and I encourage anyone interested to apply for the program."

Each year, the College underwrites the cost of participation for one faculty or staff member and partially funds participation for two students, who are eligible to earn three credits.

### **Senior Administrators Honored** by Leadership Rockland

College President Sr. Mary Eileen O'Brien, O.P., Ph.D., and Vice President for Institutional Advancement Dorothy Filoramo were honored on June 16 for their contributions to Leadership Rockland. They were among 25 Silver Medal recipients honored by

Leadership Rockland. Dominican College was honored with a medal as well.

The honor demonstrates the Dominican tradition of being involved community members. Both Sr. Mary Eileen and Ms. Filoramo have been supporters of Leadership Rockland since its inception, with Sr. Mary Eileen serving as a charter member of th Board of Leadership Rockland, Inc., and Ms. Filoramo serving as Board Chair from 2009–2012.

Leadership Rockland offers existing and emerging leaders an educational experience focused on the infrastructure of Rockland County, New York-presente by leaders in government, business, and non-profit sectors. With 600 graduates over a 25-year span, the program consists of 11 day-long sessions over a 10-month period, and engages and challenges its participants to examine issues and seek solutions.

## Seniors Present Capstone Projects at the Inaugural Liberal Arts Senior Scholars Presentation

Over 40 seniors across multiple liberal arts disciplines presented their capstone research projects at the Inaugural Liberal Arts Senior Scholars Presentation. This event was an opportunity for seniors (and a few juniors) to present posters displaying the research they had conducted for their Senior Seminar courses. Students in Math, Psychology, Communication Studies, English, and Biology met in the Lawrence Room of Rosary Hall with faculty, staff, and peers to discuss the findings of their research and what the project meant for the careers they hope to pursue after graduation.



### College Wins Alpha Award

This year, Dominican College received a Silver Alpha Award from the National Council of Alpha Lambda Delta Honor Society. Alpha Lambda Delta is an honor society for students who have succeeded in maintaining a GPA of 3.5 or higher and are in the top 20% of their class during their first year of college. The Alpha Award recognizes honor society chapters that have initiated a notably high percentage of their invited students.

In the 2014–2015 academic year, Dominican College inducted 87% of the students who were qualified and invited to join Alpha Lambda Delta. In her award letter, Dr. Glenda Earwood, Executive Director of Alpha Lambda Delta wrote, "The growth of this honor society demonstrates that more academically talented students are drawn to your campus and that the successful transition of these students from high school to college has been supported by the faculty and staff."

### New Biology Lab Dedicated

In October 2014, the College announced the dedication of a new Biology Lab. Reserved for faculty and student research, the lab is named for Madeline Micceri Mignone, the long-time director of the College's Biology Program. The lab equipment was donated by Pfizer Biotech of Pearl River.

Over the last several years, the College has established itself as one of the premier educational institutions in the Hudson Valley, with a strong science program as a distinguishing feature. Currently, the biology program enrolls over 100 students.

## College Awarded Two Major Grants

### **National Science Foundation Grant**

Dominican College was awarded \$592,688 from the National Science Foundation (NSF) to provide scholarships to students studying the biological sciences. The goal of the five-year grant is to boost the nation's STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) workforce.



This year, six freshmen at Dominican College have been awarded up to \$10,000 a year for four years as part of the new scholarship program, which is funded by the NSF grant. The program enhances the

opportunities of these academically talented students by providing internships, research experiences, and field trips. The scholarship winners work closely with each other, faculty, and administrators to ensure their success in a biology career.

**Bernadette Connors, Ph.D.**, Associate Professor of Biology, said, "This program will help to draw those students who may have financial need, but who are very passionate about learning biology and about gaining an education in all the sciences with a liberal arts background."

The students accepted this year in the scholarship program are **Stephanie Denis**, **Darian Fernandez**, **Albert Martinez**, **Kelly Murphy**, **Natalia Perez-Cervantes**, and **Amanda Saab**. Next year, eight scholarships will be awarded.

### Sparkill Creek Watershed Alliance Grant

In collaboration with the Sparkill Creek Watershed Alliance, Dominican College was awarded a grant through the Water Resources Grant Program of the NYS Water Resources Institute (WRI) at Cornell University. The grant supports the development of a course-based service learning research project that will educate and train undergraduate students in the fields of ecology and molecular microbiology.

Students taking relevant courses will analyze the diversity of plant species in the Sparkill Creek Watershed area, and will determine the level and type of fecal contamination in the waterway. As hands-on researchers under the guidance of the Sparkill Creek Watershed Alliance and the Hudson Riverkeeper, students will be encouraged to understand the role of "citizen science." The grant provides funds from April 2015–April 2016.



# Pope's Visit to New York Puts Media Spotlight on Dominican College

When Pope Francis visited the United States at the end of September, the Dominican College community shared in the excitement of all Americans. The College was fortunate to receive 40 tickets from the New York Archdiocese to participate with the Pope at the Mass celebrated at Madison Square Garden. Half of the tickets went to students. The other half went to faculty, staff, administrators, and board members chosen randomly.

A few days before the Dominican College group traveled by bus to see the Pope, College President Sr. Mary Eileen O'Brien, O.P., Ph.D., spoke live on WRCR radio about why Americans find Pope Francis so attractive. "He's fresh. He's spontaneous. He speaks from his heart. He cares. He doesn't hesitate to second guess. He will speak directly to issues, directly to people, and I think this is all very refreshing and encouraging," she said. "He's a source of great hope to people."

The Pope's visit to the U.S. and the Dominican College group's trip to see him, led to a lot of local media attention for Dominican College. In addition to Sr. Mary Eileen's live interview on WRCR radio, Director of Campus Ministry Barbara McEneany, O.P., was a commentator on *Richard French Live* on RNN-TV. Several students were featured on News 12 and WHUD radio, and News 12 covered the College's bus leaving for the Papal mass.

Sr. Mary Eileen said that the students she spoke with were impressed that Pope Francis had immense concern for all of us and was very accepting and inclusive. Because so many Dominican College students have a commitment to social justice and community service, the students said that they liked that he was constantly reaching out to people in need and reminding us to do so.



# Cooperative Agreement Signed with X'ian International University

Sr. Mary Eileen O'Brien, O.P., Ph.D., President, signed an agreement in February for cooperation between Dominican College and X'ian International University. Cooperation will include student and faculty exchanges, student transfers, and joint faculty research.

## College Hosts College Goal Event

Dominican College hosted a College Goal event on Saturday, February 7, to help college-bound students complete the most important tool in securing financial aid—the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA. A completed FAFSA can be used to apply for aid to any college or university.

Along with providing hands-on assistance with filing and submitting the FAFSA, the College's financial aid experts answered questions about financial aid, scholarships, and loans. This was the first College Goal event ever held in Rockland County.

## Dominican College Begins Offering Doctor of Nursing Practice Degree

In Fall 2015, Dominican College began offering a Doctor of Nursing Practice Degree (DNP), after receiving approval from the New York State Education Department.

The DNP has been adopted as the terminal degree for advanced practice nurses by the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) in response to the nursing shortage and the crisis in the healthcare system. Dominican College is implementing the Doctor of Nursing Practice to meet the needs of this paradigm shift and to offer the full spectrum of nursing education.

Building on current Master's Nursing Program curricula, students in this Post-Master's DNP Program will be prepared at the most advanced level of nursing practice.

# Communications Program Ranked as One of Nation's Best

Dominican College's Online Communication Studies Program ranks among the nation's top colleges, according to a new analysis by Affordable Colleges Online, a not-for-profit resource center that provides information about college cost, financial aid, and college rankings.

Dominican College is ranked #22 on AC Online's list of the "Top Online Communications Degrees." According to AC Online, colleges on the list "stand out either for cost or quality." The University of Minnesota (#1), DePaul University (#5), and Indiana University (#16), are some of the well-known institutions that are also named on the list.

## College Completes Branding and Messaging **Revitalization Project**

Following a national search, Paskill Stapleton & Lord (PS&L) was selected this year to design and lead a comprehensive branding project on behalf of the College. The decision was announced by the President, Sr. Mary Eileen O'Brien, O.P., Ph.D., on November 7, 2014. Ten agencies were considered, with four finalists invited to visit the campus and respond to a formal Request for Proposal.

Based in Philadelphia, PA, PS&L fit all the criteria the College outlined in the RFP-including a proven track record in research, brand and identity development, publications, and advertising. The firm's experience and reputation with other Catholic institutions was an important factor as well. Work on the project began in November 2014 and concluded in July 2015.

The overall goal of the project was to clarify, position, and extend the Dominican College identity with new strategies and messaging. PS&L began by conducting an intensive research project with qualitative and quantitative components using both internal and external audiences.

With the research findings in hand, PS&L created a new logo and other identity elements designed to be instantly recognizable as Dominican College. The logo and identity elements, consisting of overlapping gyrons, were put into use at the end of the summer, and currently appear on business cards, the website, campus signs, and all publications.

Among the many project components, perhaps the most important was the development of a brand rationale and brand platform that speaks to the attributes associated with the College. This includes specific messaging strategies for prospective students and a description of the brand personality of Dominican College, including tone, vocabulary, points and messages to reinforce, as well as layout designs and photography styles.

PS&L also provided a set of brand messages that will guide the College's marketing efforts and help shape the College's identity through consistent and persistent presentation. Core messaging themes

include community, academics, location, the value of a Dominican College education, the College's core values—including its Catholic heritage, and the comprehensive collegiate experience offered here. These messages will be presented and reinforced in all enrollment publications.

"The new, consistent visual identity ensures that the messaging, mission, and core values of Dominican College are aligned consistently throughout the institution through a cohesive visual framework that represents who we are," said Sr. Mary Eileen O'Brien, O.P., Ph.D., President. "The graphic standards are a vehicle for enabling our story to be heard in a cluttered and busy communications landscape."

On campus, the branding initiative was led by Brett Bekritsky, Director of Marketing and Communications.



## About Our New Logo

The College's new logo combines the name of the school with an icon that was customdesigned by PS&L's designers. The icon consists of stylized versions of the Dominican Shield and Cross. The Fitched Gyronny Cross used in the icon has a three dimensional appearance and often depicts the Star of Bethlehem at Christmas. Along with suggesting a guiding star, the icon represents a compass.

The Dominican Cross symbolically represents the Torch of Truth—a symbol of the Dominican Order that is often shown being carried in the mouth of a little black dog. The story of the dog originates in a dream St. Dominic's mother had when she was pregnant with the Saint: She dreamed of her child as a little black and white dog, illuminating the world by carrving a lit torch in his mouth.

The shield used in the icon is derived from the coat of arms for the Dominican Order and consists of black and white gyrons, or triangles, that symbolize the unity of a body of people working together for the common good.

## **ATHLETICS**



### Men's Soccer

The Dominican College men's soccer team finished the season with an overall record of 13-4-1 and a Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC) record of 9-2-1. The Chargers finished in a tie for first place in the CACC and earned the second seed in the CACC Tournament due to a loss to Philadelphia University who earned the top seed.

The team also made appearances in the NCAA East Region and NSCAA/Continental Tire East Region polls where they were ranked as high as seventh.

### Women's Soccer

The Lady Chargers soccer team finished the season with an overall record of 4-8-3 and a CACC record of 4-5-3.

The team finished in ninth place in the CACC and just missed a berth in the CACC Tournament.

## Men's Basketball

### Baseball

### Softball

The Lady Chargers were the second seed in the CACC Tournament and split on day one of the tournament with a 6-2 win over #7 Bloomfield College and a tough 2-3 loss

The team needed to win three games on day two and took down Post University, Bloomfield College, and Wilmington University to advance to the CACC Championships. In game one of the final day, the Lady Chargers lost to #1 Caldwell University, 5-2, to end their season.

In the spring, the Chargers golf team had the high finish of second place at the Philadelphia U. Tri-Match #4.

At CACC Championships, the team tied for fifth place.


