### **COURSE STRUCTURE**

When you pursue a Master of Science in Education through Dominican University, your course structure will vary depending on the program you undertake:

- ► The Childhood and Adolescence Education programs require 27 credits in studies directly related to teaching students in grades 1–6 or 7–12 and 6 credits in supervised student teaching/integrative seminar
- ▶ The dual Childhood Education/Students with Disabilities program requires 39 credits in academic studies directly related to teaching students in general and special education settings and 6 credits of supervised student teaching/integrative seminar
- ▶ The Teacher of Students with Disabilities program requires 30-33 credits in studies directly related to teaching students with disabilities, including those with severe or multiple disabilities, and 6 credits of supervised student teaching/seminars
- ➤ The Teacher of Students who are Blind or Visually Impaired program requires 21 credits in academic studies directly related to teaching students who are blind or visually impaired, a 3-credit supervised student teaching/seminar experience, and additional coursework related to health, behavioral, and other disability concerns

Also, most courses require a minimum 10-hour field component or laboratory experience, and all graduate programs require a 3-credit Research in Education course.
