

## GEC Course Substitution Guide

Starting Fall 2024, courses will no longer carry their former GEC designations (i.e., C, M, P, S, V, and G). Most of those requirements will be fulfilled by new Dominican Curriculum (DC) course or, in some cases, a course that formerly fulfilled GEC requirements. The table below lists the GEC requirements for students entering the University prior to Fall 2023 and the courses that can be used to fulfill those requirements if they have not already fulfilled them.
